School Programs

FIELD TRIPS FOR GRADES 1-12

Franklin Park Conservatory provides an active learning environment—a living classroom for your school tour. Students interact with native and exotic plant collections and have fun learning about science, the environment, and the arts. Each of the programs offered has been evaluated with regard to Ohio's Academic Content Standards.

Each school tour program lasts approximately 50 minutes. Through January 3, 2010, groups may choose to include a visit to the Franklin Park Conservatory Hot Shop with their tour and watch as local, professional glass blowers – gaffers – transform molten glass into hand blown art glass pieces. The 25 minute demonstrations begin on the half-hour from 11 a.m. - 2 p.m. weekdays. The Hot Shop is located in an outdoor courtyard, under roof, and will operate through January 3, 2010. HABITAT ADVENTURE

September 14 - June 11

Review the basic needs of plants and animals. Compare and contrast plant adaptations and food webs in mountain, desert, and tropical habitats.



BLOOMS & BUTTERFLIES

March 15 - June 11

Witness plant and animal interactions. Discover how butterflies rely on plants at every life stage and the value of pollination's to insects, plants and humans.



BOTANY BASICS

September 14 - June 11

Plant science comes alive for you and your students in the most biodiverse plant collection under glass in central Ohio. Walk through a rainforest in winter, reviewing plant classification, form and function.



PLANTS AND OUR CHANGING ENVIRONMENT

Plants cope with their environment with a dazzling array of adaptations. As climate changes, how will plants adapt? Learn about climate and human impacts on this tour.
