**GARDENS AGLOW CELEBRATES CLASSIC HOLIDAY TRADITIONS WITH
BOTANICAL FLAIR**

Columbus, OH — Franklin Park Conservatory and Botanical Gardens presents *Gardens Aglow* (formerly *Merry & Bright*) on view November 18, 2017–January 3, 2018. Every year, visitors enjoy their favorite holiday traditions at the Conservatory, from twinkling lights illuminating horticulture displays, to the sky-high poinsettia tree, to Paul Busse’s enchanted Garden Railway.

Gardens Aglow is open from 10am–5pm from November 18–30. Beginning in December, *Gardens Aglow* will remain open until 9pm, allowing guests to experience the light displays after dark. Please note: The Conservatory is closed on Thanksgiving and Christmas Day and will close at 5pm on December 24.

***Gardens Aglow* Highlights**

- Over 1,400 glass pieces made exclusively in the Hot Shop adorn three Ornament Trees, highlighting the countless artistic styles of glass blowers at the Conservatory. Visitors can design their own glass ornament (templates available [online](#)), or purchase ornaments in Botanica Gift Shop & Greenhouse.
- Enjoy over 80 miniature, multimedia artworks by 31 artists from across Ohio on display in the Cardinal Health Gallery. For over 100 years, Ohio Art League’s annual **Thumb Box** exhibition has challenged artists to create unique pieces with only one criteria: the work cannot exceed 6 inches in any direction. Gallery sponsors include the Greater Columbus Arts Council, The Columbus Foundation and the Ohio Arts Council.
- The 11th Annual Gingerbread Competition, on display beginning December 5, features creative and delightful entries in four categories: Youth, Teen, Adult and Family. This year’s theme is **Holiday Traditions**. Interested participants can deliver their entries on December 2 & 3. Contest rules available at www.fpconservatory.org.
- A plethora of family activities and entertainment are slated for the holiday season, including crafts every weekend and musical performances during extended evening hours. Events are included with admission unless otherwise noted. For a full schedule of events, visit www.fpconservatory.org.
- Special events and dining opportunities are available for all ages. Candlelight Nights, Wednesdays, December 6, 13 and 20 at 6pm, allow guests to dine in the warm and exotic John F. Wolfe Palm House. On December 2 and 9 from 8:30am–10am, join Santa for breakfast, a meet-and-greet photo opportunity, and to decorate holiday cookies.
