UPGRADES IN AIR FILTRATION AT THE CONSERVATORY MAKE FACILITY SAFER

Columbus, OH — Franklin Park Conservatory and Botanical Gardens is proud to announce the addition of new PlasmaPURE AutoClean 1500 air purification units to its heating, ventilation, and air conditioning systems.

The PlasmaPURE AutoClean unit is a self-cleaning, maintenance-free Needle Point Bi-Polar Ionizer that produces positive and negative ions that neutralize harmful pollutants and kills airborne viruses, including COVID-19.

In addition to killing viruses, mold and bacteria, the air purifier also reduces airborne particles like dust, pollen, and pet dander.

The Conservatory strives to provide the safest visitor experience possible, by adding one of the most powerful air purification technologies on the market, guests can expect clean air and peace of mind.
