HAT DAY BREAKS FUNDRAISING RECORD FOR THE ANNUAL EVENT

Columbus, OH—On May 6, 2022, Franklin Park Conservatory and Botanical Gardens hosted the 21st *Les Chapeaux dans le Jardin*, its signature spring fundraising event. Guests donned their chapeaux and gathered outside of the historic John F. Wolfe Palm House for cocktails on the Wolfe Terrace and a program and luncheon under the grand marquis.

This year's Hat Day event grossed over \$650,000, a Hat Day record, which benefits the Conservatory's youth outreach and education programs. All Hat Day proceeds support school field trips, educator visits to school classrooms, preschool programs, job training for eligible teens, free family programs and so much more!

Her academic background and personal passion for nature and public gardens have made her an invaluable volunteer, advisor and supporter of the Conservatory for over twenty years.

Franklin Park Conservatory and Botanical Gardens offers world-class horticulture, art and nature-based exhibitions, and educational programs for all ages. Situated on 40 acres on the eastern side of Franklin Park, the Conservatory features the historic 1895 John F. Wolfe Palm House; 83,000 square feet of glasshouses; botanical gardens including the Scotts Miracle-Gro Foundation Children's Garden; and meeting and event spaces. The Conservatory owns the largest collection of glass artwork by Dale Chihuly in a botanical garden and is home to internationally recognized light artist James Turrell's Light Raiment II, which illuminates the John F. Wolfe Palm House every evening from dusk until dawn.
