FRANKLIN: THE PEOPLES PARK

ON DISPLAY THROUGH NOVEMBER 19, 2023

The works of local photographer Steve Harrison document activity in Franklin Park over the last 50 years, from everyday occurrences to historical moments. A collection of these photographs will be on display in the Cardinal Health Gallery.

Harrison began photographing the park in the 1960s when it was a gathering place for young black people. He also captured historical moments in the park from the 1960s to present-day, including Ameriflora and Dick Gregory's Food Run. These moments, preserved as black and white images, are brought together into one gallery for community members to reminisce and reflect. **fpconservatory.org/franklin-the-peoples-park**

ON DISPLAY IN THE GRAND MALLWAY THROUGH JANUARY 7, 2024

All aboard! *The Paul Busse Garden Railway* returns to the Grand Mallway this summer. Guests can make a return trip to their favorite destinations: Fairytale Land, Wild West Town, European Travels and the animal-themed Who Lives Here. Nine g-scale model trains travel across over 1,000 feet of track that runs high and low through the themed destinations. A miniature world of 51 botanical models made from all-natural plant material opens itself up for exploration as the trains whirl around you. TEEN CORPS AT THE CONSERVATORY

With the support of our volunteers, the Conservatory grows and harvests nearly 3,000 pounds of produce each year! In addition to supplying this fresh produce to our neighborhood food pantries, 24 Columbus teens were able to get their hands dirty, tending their own community garden bed while building leadership skills this summer by working in the Farmers Market. For many Teen Corps members, this is their first exposure to gardening, sustainability, and even certain vegetables. But, the education does not stop with teens! The Growing to Green program, the 47 garden plots in the Community Garden Campus, and our Communal Garden education series provide ample opportunities for community members to create dialogue around urban gardening and grow more 'good' in our community.
