PUMPKINS AGLOW RETURNS TO FRANKLIN PARK CONSERVATORY

Columbus, OH — *Pumpkins Aglow* brings hundreds of jack-o-lanterns, enchanting light displays, family-friendly entertainment and more to Franklin Park Conservatory and Botanical Gardens on select evenings: October 11-15, 18-22 & 25-29. Tickets for this fan-favorite Special Engagement are selling fast so make sure to reserve your tickets soon.

Pumpkins Aglow transforms the outdoor gardens into a glowing pumpkin patch. Hundreds of jack-o-lanterns—carved by Conservatory staff, members and volunteers—illuminate the gardens which are filled with bewitching scenes. Visit returning favorites, the gardening skeletons and Pumpkin Houses, and new bewitching displays, the pumpkin tunnel light show and an alien invasion. The decorations are spooky but fun, as *Pumpkins Aglow* is meant for all ages to enjoy.

Accenting the scenes are the rich horticultural displays of <u>Harvest Blooms</u>, another fall exhibition on display during admission from September 23 through October 29, 2023. The entire Conservatory is open these evenings, including the indoor plant <u>collections</u>, the <u>Chihuly Collection</u>, <u>Paul Busse Garden Railway</u> and <u>Franklin the Peoples Park</u>.

Each evening includes entertainment such as crafts, pumpkin-themed lawn games and a family-friendly dance area. Watch light-up jugglers October 11-15, Wheel of Death on October 18-22 or a sway pole witch October 25-29. The <u>Glass Pumpkin Patch</u> will be available each evening for visitors to purchase glass pumpkins made by local artists and other autumn-themed items.

Visitors looking for refreshments during the experience can purchase food from the indoor Garden Café and a rotating set of outdoor food trucks. An outdoor cash bar will serve beer, wine and a specialty cocktail, as well as non-alcoholic drinks and mocktails.
