Across the organization, we reached milestones that invited us to pause, reflect and celebrate. These moments speak to the powerful relationship between the Conservatory, the passionate team who cares for it and the community that brings it to life. Together, we advanced our shared mission to connect people to nature and create life-enhancing experiences.

This year, transformational philanthropy propelled our mission forward. A historic \$35 million gift from the Wolfe Family, alongside the Women's Sustaining Board's largest contribution to date, strengthened our foundation and brought new visions to life. We introduced dynamic experiences like *Sean Kenney's Nature Connects®*, featuring larger-than-life sculptures made of thousands of LEGO® bricks, and launched an enhanced Urban Garden Leadership Academy. Internally, we invested in our team through our first professional development conference, "A Day to Grow," and celebrated meaningful recognition of staff and the organization at both local and national levels.

Our ongoing commitment to community outreach and education remained a vital throughline in all we do. We welcomed thousands of students for hands-on field trips, supported hundreds of gardeners through the free Communal Garden Series and increased access to fresh, locally grown food on the Near East Side through our summer Farmers Market. Together, these efforts deepened community connections while expanding access to nature, education and nourishment.

As excitement for the North Star Master Plan grows, so does the community's shared commitment to the Conservatory's future. None of this progress happens by chance—it is the result of sustained support, shared vision and a belief in the power of connection.

LISTENING, LEARNING & LOOKING AHEAD

Following the public unveiling of the North Star Master Plan in May 2024, the Conservatory remained committed to ensuring this ambitious vision continued to be shaped by community voices. Throughout 2025, President & CEO Bruce Harkey presented the Master Plan to community groups, neighborhood associations and area commissions—including the Near East Area Commission, Franklin Park Civic Association, Eastgate Garden Civic Association and Bronzeville Neighborhood Association—creating opportunities for dialogue, questions and feedback. Building on the extensive community engagement that informed the development of the North Star Master Plan, these conversations helped ensure transparency, addressed community questions and concerns and reinforced the Conservatory's commitment to keeping neighbors informed and engaged as this vision moves forward.

FROM ROOTS TO BLOOMS

From September 20, 2025, through January 4, 2026, the Conservatory invited guests to explore the North Star Master Plan through an immersive exhibition in the Cardinal Health Gallery titled *The Conservatory: From Roots to Blooms*. This interactive exhibition introduced visitors to the Conservatory's bold vision for the future, guiding them through our past, present and the exciting plans that will shape our next chapter.

Through digital interactives, interpretive displays and storytelling elements, guests were encouraged to reflect on personal memories made at the Conservatory and to share feedback on the proposed transformation. Visitors contributed more than 340 reflections and responses to the prompts, which invited them to consider questions such as:

- 🌱 *What sustainable or environmentally friendly features would you like to see in the North Star Master Plan?*
- 🌱 *What change are you most excited about in the North Star Master Plan?*
- 🌱 *How do you think the North Star Master Plan will make a difference for the local community?*
- 🌱 *What features would make these spaces more inclusive and help everyone feel welcome?*

A standout feature of the exhibition was a vibrant mural created by Columbus-based artist Shelbi Toone, inspired by the gardens-forward philosophy at the heart of the North Star Master Plan. The mural served as both a visual anchor and an invitation to reflect on the future of the Conservatory.

Throughout the exhibition, visitors were reminded that the North Star Master Plan is not only a roadmap for growth, but a community-driven vision shaped by shared experiences, memories and aspirations for Franklin Park Conservatory.

We received powerful reflections from the community, including:

“The future looks promising for Franklin Park Conservatory.”

“Amazing new biomes to explore!”

“Love it all! FPC is a beautiful, inspiring place for my family and myself.”

“Preservation of the Victorian Palm House will be a huge win for the history of the community!”

LISTENING, LEARNING & LOOKING AHEAD

CELEBRATING A STORIED CHAPTER

In preparation for the start of construction in the John F. Wolfe Palm House and Dorothy M. Davis Showhouse in early 2026, the Conservatory encouraged guests, event attendees and staff to experience these iconic spaces before they closed to undergo an exciting transformation.

Throughout the year, these beloved spaces continued to serve as the backdrop for some of life's most meaningful moments. In 2025, the Palm House hosted more than 100 weddings, proposals, corporate and social events, holiday gatherings and special events that brought people together under the historic glass canopy.

Rather than a farewell, 2025 was an invitation to pause, to gather and to celebrate the memories created within these glass walls. By encouraging the community to savor these experiences before construction began, we honored the legacy of the Palm House and Showhouse while generating anticipation for their next chapter.







WHERE COMMUNITY, ART & LEARNING MEET

SEAN KENNEY'S NATURE CONNECTS® **ART, CREATIVITY & CONNECTION**

During the 2025 summer season, the Conservatory presented *Nature Connects®*, creating a dynamic and engaging experience for visitors of all ages. On view from May 31 through September 7, 2025, the exhibition featured 18 large-scale sculptures created from LEGO® bricks by acclaimed artist Sean Kenney and presented in collaboration with Imagine Exhibitions. Constructed from more than 250,000 individual bricks, the giant sculptures celebrated the unique intersection of art, nature and creativity, offering a fresh and playful way for guests to connect with the natural world.

Nature Connects® was accompanied by a range of interactive and family-focused programming. The Brick Build Gallery, located in the Cardinal Health Gallery, invited guests to explore engineering and imagination through hands-on building. The Conservatory also hosted its first-ever brick-building competition, encouraging participants to create nature-inspired designs. In addition, seven themed Brick Nights offered unique after-hours experiences, welcoming guests to explore the giant *Nature Connects®* sculptures at night while enjoying activities tied to themes such as Superheroes & Villains, Favorite Video Games and Cheers for the Home Team.

Together, the exhibition and its associated engagement opportunities drove strong attendance during a critical summer season. During the three-month run of *Nature Connects®*, the Conservatory experienced a 6% increase in admissions compared to the same period in the previous year.

REVITALIZING THE BELOVED CHILDREN'S GARDEN

Spanning two acres, the Scotts Miracle-Gro Foundation Children's Garden remains one of the Conservatory's most treasured spaces, offering immersive, hands-on experiences that connect children to the beauty and diversity of Ohio's natural environment.

Since opening in 2018, the Children's Garden has welcomed thousands of families each year, with more than 50,000 children exploring the space in 2025 alone. Designed as a year-round living classroom, the Children's Garden supports learning through play and exploration. In 2025, Conservatory educators delivered more than 160 informal nature programs, including 137 Discovery Station sessions, 18 Story Time sit-downs and 13 Let's Grow Garden Club sessions, introducing children to gardening, native plants, wildlife and environmental stewardship.

Because of the Children's Garden's popularity, ongoing maintenance and care are essential. In 2025, the Conservatory made the careful decision to close the Children's Garden for an entire month to complete necessary renovations and revitalization work. Beginning in March, teams across Horticulture, Engineering and Exhibits collaborated to complete more than ten projects during the four-week closure.

Major improvements included pipeline maintenance for the well-loved Misting Boulders water feature, ensuring its continued enjoyment for guests.

The horticulture team refreshed garden beds throughout the space—clearing, weeding, reseeding and planting perennials, while also renewing Fibar safety surfaces in multiple play areas and repairing turf in the Sunrise Lawn.

In partnership with Ahlum & Arbor Tree Preservation, trees across the garden were pruned to support the long-term health of the native tree collection. From reinforcing the foundation of the Cob Playhouse to installing a new path to the Whisper Bench, structural improvements played an important role as well. Also included in maintenance was a thorough cleaning of interactive art features, such as the Salamander Tail, dimple rocks, gnomes and Misting Boulders.

Following these improvements, the Children's Garden reopened to overwhelmingly positive feedback. **"More than any year before, I have heard guests complimenting how beautiful and vibrant the space is,"** shared Danielle Leininger, Children's Garden Manager. Today, the refreshed Children's Garden offers an even more welcoming environment where children and families can play, learn and connect with nature year-round.

These special maintenance and operations projects were made possible, in part, through the generosity of donors who have invested in the Conservatory's Endowment Fund at The Columbus Foundation.



ROOTED IN EXCELLENCE, GROWING TOGETHER

RECOGNIZING EXCELLENCE ACROSS THE ORGANIZATION

The Conservatory's leadership was recognized throughout the year for their vision, service and commitment to community impact. President & CEO, Bruce Harkey, was named a 2025 C-Suite Award honoree by Columbus Business First, an honor celebrating outstanding executive leadership across the Columbus region. Bruce was also recognized as a 2025 Columbus Smart Business Network honoree, which acknowledges the heart and vision he has brought to the Conservatory since 2007.

Bruce's influence extended beyond the Conservatory as well. He was honored for his outstanding service as President of the American Public Gardens Association (APGA) at APGA's annual conference and now proudly serves as APGA's Past President. Bruce's leadership with APGA demonstrates the Conservatory's commitment to serving as a champion for the field of public horticulture and promoting learning for all. Bruce's dedication and vision continues to expand opportunities for community connection and guides the organization forward through the North Star Master Plan. We are grateful for the leadership, innovation and collaboration he continues to bring to the Conservatory.

We also proudly celebrated Jenny Pope, Director of Community Outreach and Education, as she was named a Trailblazer in the Columbus Business First 2025 Women of Influence Awards. Jenny's visionary, servant leadership has transformed how the Conservatory connects with the community through expanding access, fostering inclusion and deepening educational impact. Jenny's work in community outreach and education is honorable, and she continues to inspire colleagues and partners daily.

These individual honors were complemented by organizational recognition when Franklin Park Conservatory and Botanical Gardens received its first 2025 Top Workplace Award by Columbus Top Workplaces. Based entirely on confidential employee feedback collected by Energage LLC, the award reflects staff experiences related to respect, support, growth opportunities and empowerment, underscoring the Conservatory's commitment to cultivating a positive, engaging and thriving workplace culture.

INVESTING IN OUR PEOPLE & CULTURE

In a milestone moment for staff development, the Conservatory's BIOME (Building Inclusive Opportunities for Meaningful Employment) Council hosted the inaugural "A Day to Grow" conference, the organization's first all-staff learning and development conference. The day was rooted in thoughtful dialogue, meaningful connections and interactive professional development opportunities designed to support both personal and professional growth for all employees.

With engaging keynote and breakout sessions led by inspiring community speakers, "A Day to Grow" reinforced our belief that investing in our people is essential to achieving our mission and nurturing a culture grounded in equity, learning and collaboration.

STRENGTHENING OPERATIONS FOR THE FUTURE

Alongside investments in staff and culture, the Conservatory made important internal improvements to strengthen efficiency, collaboration and safety. In March 2025, the organization completed a transition from Google Suite to the Microsoft Suite, streamlining communication and improving coordination across teams.

Also in the first quarter of 2025, construction was completed on a new Security Dispatch Office. This improved facility enhances campus safety through 24/7 video surveillance, on-site security staff and centralized management of radios and safes. The Security Dispatch Office represents a significant investment in protecting our visitors, staff, assets and operations, helping ensure the Conservatory remains a safe and welcoming place for all.





ACCESS & LEADERSHIP IN THE COMMUNITY

COMMUNITY DAYS

In 2025, the Conservatory hosted 12 Community Days, welcoming more than 28,000 City of Columbus and Franklin County residents through free admission.

Community Days were offered in partnership with a total of 118 local community organizations, an increase from 96 organizations in 2024. Each Community Day featured themes such as celebrating local food and agriculture, music and movement, cultural traditions and wellness activities like yoga.

By removing financial barriers, Community Days continue to play a vital role in expanding access and ensuring the Conservatory can be enjoyed by everyone.

URBAN GARDEN LEADERSHIP ACADEMY

In 2025, Growing to Green launched the Urban Garden Leadership Academy (UGLA), an initiative designed to empower and equip leaders in Central Ohio's community gardening and urban agriculture landscape. The 12-week pilot academy ran from August 27 through November 19 and was developed in collaboration with experts from across Columbus, including Ohio State University Extension, Columbus Public Health, community organizations and experienced garden leaders.

Through interactive workshops, site visits, mentorship and peer learning, participants explored topics such as garden planning, advanced growing techniques, food systems and policy, community outreach, storytelling and visibility, budgeting, fundraising and organizational leadership.

Participants described UGLA as both practical and transformational. Many participants highlighted learning that leadership in community gardening is relational, collaborative and deeply connected to neighborhood well-being. **"What's been most rewarding about my UGLA experience is getting to be in a room of people with such different backgrounds,"** shared participant, Max. Others noted increased confidence and readiness to apply new skills, with one participant sharing plans to build new gardens focused on food access and education.

With a strong emphasis on inclusion, sustainability and community connection, UGLA is helping cultivate a new generation of leaders who are increasing their community's access to fresh food, strengthening neighborhood resilience and creating thriving green spaces across Central Ohio.

THE WOMEN'S BOARD: LEADERSHIP, SERVICE & LASTING IMPACT

The Conservatory's Women's Board continued its extraordinary legacy of leadership and service in 2025, achieving new milestones while strengthening their connection to the community.

In 2025, the Women's Board celebrated its largest-ever donation from the annual *Field to Table* fundraising event. The Women's Board donated a remarkable \$505,000 from event proceeds to support community outreach, education and access programs at the Conservatory. This marked the 17th *Field to Table* event, bringing total giving from this signature fundraiser to more than \$5.4 million.

In addition to fundraising leadership, Women's Board members generously contributed 4,443 volunteer hours in 2025, representing a value of more than \$144,000. Their service extended throughout the community and the Conservatory, including volunteering at three community gardens through the Growing to Green Community Volunteering initiative, and sponsoring the June Community Day with free hands-on activities for children and providing volunteer support throughout the day.

Other highlights from the year include the annual Community Garden Bus Tour, which allowed Women's Board members to visit several Growing to Green partner gardens and learn directly from garden leaders, and an overnight educational trip to the Brandywine Valley, where members visited Longwood Gardens, Chanticleer, Mt. Cuba Center and Nemours Estate while gathering ideas and inspiration to bring home to the Conservatory.

The Women's Board also welcomed 23 new members in the Class of 2025, ensuring continued leadership and energy for years to come.

CELEBRATING EVENT CHAIRS: STEWARDSHIP BEHIND OUR SIGNATURE FUNDRAISERS

The Conservatory's long running fundraising events, *Hat Day* and *Field to Table*, are beloved traditions. But behind each successful event is a team of dedicated volunteer leaders who work year-round to ensure every detail is thoughtfully planned for a successful event.

HAT DAY 2025

The 24th annual *Les Chapeaux dans le Jardin (Hat Day)* took place on Friday, May 2, 2025, under the leadership of *Hat Day* Chairs Erin Shannon, Meg Kelley and Maryann Kelley. This year's event featured an unforgettable runway show, *Fleurs et Couture: Designs Inspired by the Four Seasons*, showcasing the artistry of twelve local floral designers. Working in collaboration with community models, each a leader from a Columbus nonprofit, the designers created floral hats, headpieces and accessories inspired by each unique season of spring, summer, fall and winter.

Hat Day also honored Tom Katzenmeyer as the recipient of the 2025 Ann Isaly Wolfe Award, recognizing his outstanding leadership, service and commitment to both the Conservatory and the greater Columbus community. Thanks to generous support from guests and sponsors, *Hat Day* 2025 raised more than \$495,000 to benefit the Conservatory's youth education and outreach programs, providing transformative opportunities for thousands of young people to connect with the natural world.

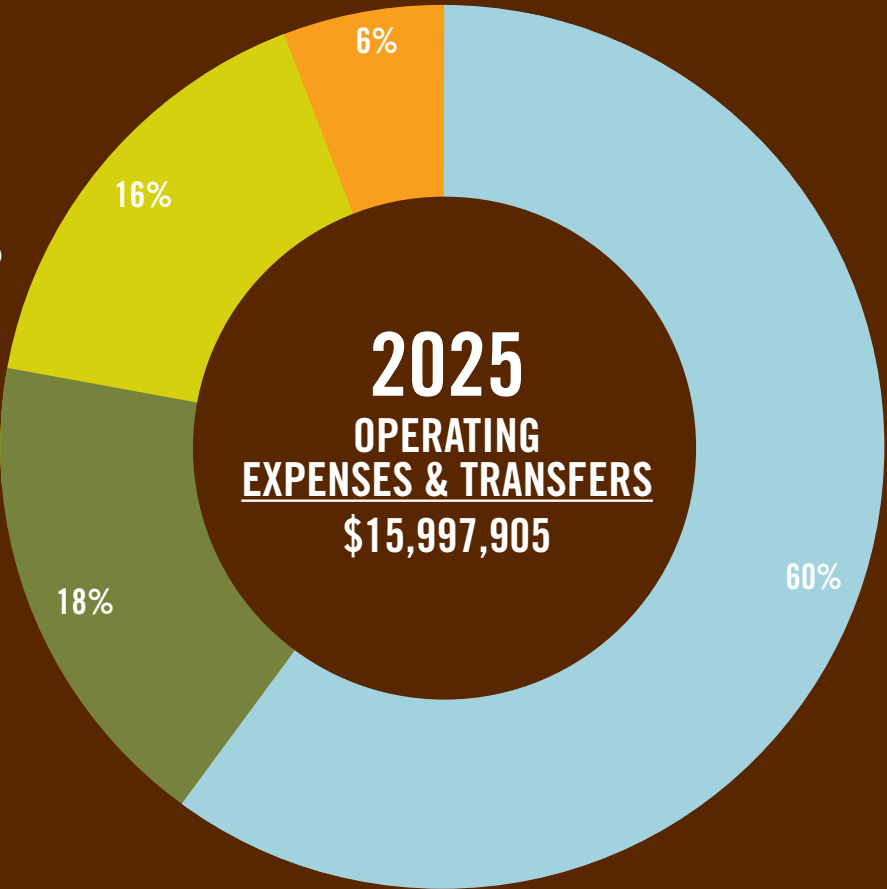
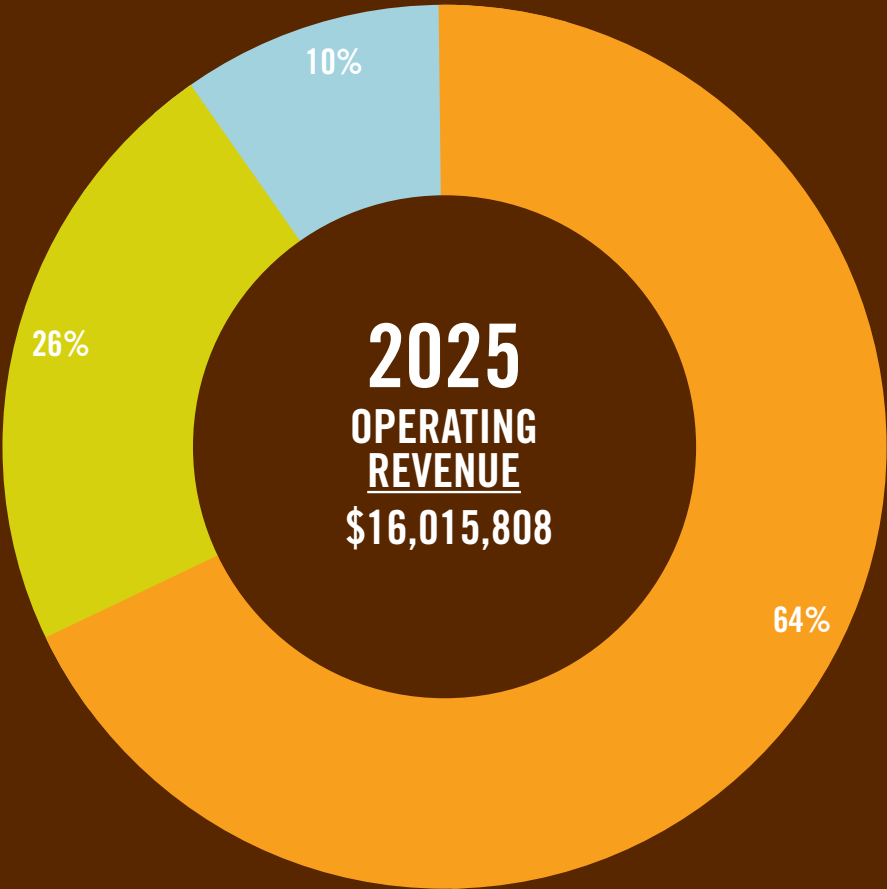
FIELD TO TABLE 2025
